Township Assistance Report November 2022

Benton Township, Monroe County, IN

- A gentleman called with an offer of fire wood for a resident in need. He has donated wood in past
 years as well. This year he would like to receive an income tax credit and he requested that the
 Township pay for the pickup and delivery of the fire wood. It was suggested that he contact SCCAP,
 the South-Central Community Action Program. SCCAP provides vouchers to those in need for fire
 wood.
- 2. A resident reached out to our office regarding another resident in need. We explained what Township Assistance is, and that we would be happy to meet with both him and the resident of concern, but in keeping with the right to privacy, we cannot share further information about any assistance case.
- 3. We reached out to 15 households from our 2022 Township Assistance applications and asked if they would be interested in receiving help for Thanksgiving and the December holiday season. 9 families said that they would like to accept help. 2 families said they were back on their feet and did not need the help but appreciated the offer. 2 families no longer had working telephone numbers and 2 families did not respond. The families being helped consist of 20 adults and 5 children.
 - 8 families received Thanksgiving boxes of food. 9 families will receive both food and gifts in December. These items are being provided for by Cub Scout Troop 133. This Unionville Elementary School troop will be disbanding in the new year of 2023. The Unionville Hotshots 4-H Club may also help with the December distribution. A large family with 5 children all under 8 years old was referred to the December 10, 2022, shop with a fire-fighter program.
- 4. A returning applicant asked for help applying for food stamps. A second on-line application was filled out. The client was contacted by our office multiple times with instructions for in initial telephone appointment with FSSA (Family Social Services Administration). At this time, we do not know if this appointment was kept.
- 5. A couple living in a local apartment requested help with rent due to recent unemployment and illness. We were able to provide this. By providing this aide, the tenants were allowed to begin another annual lease.
- 6. A senior citizen was hospitalized in the Spring and forgot to get his propane tank filled at that time, taking advantage of the cheaper fuel pricing. He requested help paying for propane for heat. At the time he only had a wood burning stove and was unable to prepare the wood needed due to lingering symptoms. We provided a tank fill-up. Without any unusual circumstances, this propane should last for 12 months.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF BENTON TOWNSHIP, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA TO TRANSFER FUNDS

The Township Board of Benton Township, Monroe County, Indiana (the "Board") met at a duly called and authorized meeting of the Board on the date set forth below, such meeting being called pursuant to notice stating the time, place, and purpose of the meeting received by all Board Members and published according to statute, and the following resolutions were made, seconded and adopted by those present at the meeting, which constitute a majority of the Board.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Ind. Code 6-1.1-18-6 the Township may transfer money from one major budget classification to another; and,

WHEREAS, the Township has nearly exhausted funds in its Township Assistance fund and wishes to have adequate resources at hand to cover any end of year Township Assistance applications, and,

WHEREAS, the Township has adequate funds appropriated for 2022 by the Board in its General Operating Fund; and,

WHEREAS, the Township estimates that Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) is an appropriate amount to support the Township Assistance needs of the Township through the end of 2022; and,

WHEREAS, the Township finds that the transfer is necessary and does not require the expenditure of more money than the total amount set out in the approved 2022 Budget.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Trustee be, and hereby is, authorized and empowered to transfer the amounts identified here from the Township General Operating Fund into the Township Assistance Fund.
